

# The Ahmad Jamal Archive in Homewood



The "Journeys & Jazz" event at the Community Engagement Center in Homewood on Feb. 19 celebrated Ahmad Jamal's legacy and Pittsburgh's deep jazz roots. Items from Jamal's extensive collection of records, sheet music, photographs, and memorabilia, recently acquired by the ULS's Archives & Special Collections, were on display at the event.





Speakers highlighted Ahmad Jamal's early career, his influential album "At the Pershing: But Not for Me," and his Chicago restaurant, *The Alhambra*. The evening featured discussions on jazz's cultural significance, Jamal's impact on music, and a live performance by the *Cliff Barnes Organ Quartet*. Attendees, including musicians and community members, reflected on Jamal's improvisational genius and Pittsburgh's rich jazz heritage, reinforcing the importance of preserving and celebrating local musical history.

#### A Collaborative Mural Project is Underway at Hillman Library

In January, the ULS commissioned local artist <u>Alison</u> <u>Zapata</u> to create a participatory mural at Hillman Library with the help of Pitt students. After a very competitive process, the eight students selected to participate have been busy brainstorming ideas, developing a design mock-up, and executing the mural under the artist's direction.



The finished mural, intended to celebrate textual and visual communication themes through history and cultures, will commemorate the completion of Hillman Library's multi-year reinvention, adding a large-scale creative work to the fully renovated library.




