The doors of the completely renovated Hillman Library opened on May 8 to reveal the new entrance volume and the ground floor. This marked the end of the

almost eight-year top-to-bottom renovation and reinvention of Hillman Library!



The newly transformed library offers inspiring, light-filled learning spaces, access to hands-on technology and maker tools with dedicated support, and opportunities to explore unique local and national archival treasures.



The University Library System Director, Kornelia Tancheva, greeted Qiong Wu, Visiting Scholar in Asian Studies, who was the first student to enter the renovated entrance.

People gathered in the new glass entrance volume, which allows cascades of light through each library floor. The soon-to-reopen One Button Studio is part of the Calderone Media Row, a purpose-built media suite with an audio recording studio and two editing booths.




The first floor features a large interactive digital screen called Pitt Research Matters, showcasing research at the University.
