Rusty originally hails from Pittsburgh.

Cobras and Cults: Wes Craven's unproduced *Twilight Adventure*


In 1984, while finishing edits and filming *A Nightmare on Elm Street*, Wes Craven was also working on a script titled *Twilight Adventure*. The script was co-authored with Vada Nayak, and a revised script from August 1984 now sits within our Horror Studies Collections. Cursory research did not turn up any information about this project, so it is unclear how serious the project was or if it made it past the scriptwriting stage. But let us explore this rare and unproduced script here.
